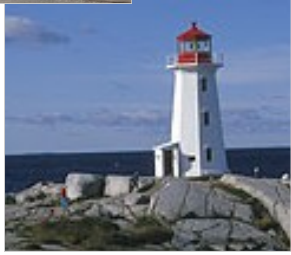


# Atlantic Maritimes Tour

## **Friday, September 21, 2012 • Halifax**

Arrive in Halifax and check in to your accommodations for a two-night stay. Your lovely hotel is ideally located in the downtown core.

## **Saturday, September 22, 2012 • Halifax Touring**

Enjoy a **Deluxe Historic Halifax City Tour** this morning. The afternoon is free to further explore this delightful seaside city. This evening, meet your fellow travelers and tour director at a welcome reception. (Continental Breakfast)

## **Sunday, September 23, 2012 • Annapolis Valley**

Discover the rustic charm of the famous fishing village of **Peggy's Cove** where you will enjoy breakfast. Next, visit the **UNESCO World Heritage Town of Lunenburg** and choose between either admission to the Fisheries Museum of the Atlantic or a walking tour of this historic community. (Breakfast, Dinner)

## **Monday, September 24, 2012 • Annapolis Valley – Moncton**

Your journey takes you through the lush Annapolis Valley and on to Grand Pre where fact and fiction blend to reveal the romance of the Land of Evangeline. Continue past the communities of Truro and Amherst as you cross into New Brunswick, spending the night in the bilingual city of Moncton. (Breakfast)

## **Tuesday, September 25, 2012 • Moncton – Charlottetown**

Your tour continues to **Hopewell Rocks** where you may walk on the ocean floor at low tide. After lunch, cross to Prince Edward Island on **Confederation Bridge**, the world's longest continuous multi-span bridge, and enjoy a delicious lobster supper (meat alternative available) before checking in to your Charlottetown accommodations for a two night stay. (Breakfast, Dinner)

## **Wednesday, September 26, 2012 • Prince Edward Island Touring**

The morning is yours at leisure before embarking on an afternoon of touring throughout Prince Edward Island. First, enjoy a tour of Charlottetown, Canada's Birthplace. Then it's off to see the red sandstone cliffs, white beaches, gently sloping sand dunes and green fields of **Prince Edward Island National Park**, the scenery that Lucy Maud Montgomery describes in her "Anne of Green Gables" books. Visit the home of "Green Gables", a Mecca for people from around the globe. This evening, enjoy a theatre performance\* at the Confederation Centre of the Arts, or a substitution activity depending on the theatre schedule. (Breakfast, Lunch)

## **Thursday September 27, 2012 • Charlottetown – Baddeck**

Take the ferry to Nova Scotia, and then proceed to **Cape Breton Island** - "the Scotland of North America." Visit the **Alexander Graham Bell National Historic Site** in Baddeck to marvel at the many accomplishments of this genius. Spend two nights at a charming lakeside resort in the heart of Baddeck. (Breakfast, Dinner)

## **Friday, September 28, 2012 • Cabot Trail Touring**

You're off to experience one of the most picturesque drives in North America, the **Cabot Trail**. **Cape Breton Highlands National Park** is next, as you wind along this ribbon of highway, where the mountains meet the sea. The vistas abound as you travel over the flat-topped mountains. Tonight there is a "Farewell" dinner. (Breakfast, Picnic Lunch, Dinner)

**Saturday, September 29, 2012 • Baddeck – Halifax**

The **Fortress of Louisbourg National Historic Site** awaits you. This reconstruction recreates one-fifth of the town of 1744 - words will not do justice to the scope of this tribute to New France. Roam the streets, talking with some of the costumed guides who remain in character, or sample the sustenance of the era. Your tour continues along the shores of **Bras d'Or** to the mainland. The last night is at a downtown Halifax hotel. (Breakfast)

**Sunday, September 30, 2012 • Return**

Tour arrangements end on check out from the hotel. (Continental Breakfast)

**Payment Schedule:**

A deposit of \$500 is due with registration. Final Payment is due 90 days before departure. Invoice will be sent out prior to final payment. *Early registration is encouraged.*

**Currency:**

Currency exchange rates fluctuate constantly. In the event of a significant drop in the value of the dollar, we reserve the right to add a currency surcharge to the price of the tour

**Refund/Cancellation Policy:**

All cancellations must be in writing and the date of postmark will determine the amount of refund due. Refunds are based on the number of days prior to the departure date. From the time of deposit to 100 days before departure, a \$100 per person administrative fee will be assessed. From 99-15 days, a \$300 per person penalty plus any nonrefundable deposit to ground suppliers as well as penalties imposed by the airlines (if applicable) will be assessed. Airline tickets once issued are generally not refundable. Anyone canceling less than 14 days prior to departure will receive **no refund**.

*Purchase of health, baggage and trip cancellation insurance is strongly recommended.*

**Terms and Conditions:**
