Day 1: Monday, July 15 • Montreal

Our adventure begins as we cross the international border with our neighbors to the north. Bienvenue a Quebec! We arrive in Montreal, where we are met by our guide and taken on a panoramic tour of the city. Montreal is the second largest French-speaking city in the world, although many of her residents are bi-lingual (or multi-lingual). We pass through some of the neighborhoods with steep staircases and lovely window boxes. We see shopping streets, magnificent museums, and great green spaces. We stop for a visit at St. Joseph's Oratory, an impressive building with sweeping views from the top of Mont Royal. We then check into our hotel to freshen up before dinner as a group. (D)

Day 2: Tuesday, July 16 • Montreal

Old Montreal is a lovely mix of old and new. Cobblestone streets lead to 300-year-old French-colonial buildings housing avant garde art galleries and hi-tech start-ups. We take a walking tour through this neighborhood, starting at the history on display at Pointe-a-Calliere Museum and ending at Bonsecours market. The small restaurants offering world cuisines in the area are a perfect spot for lunch on our own. We spend this afternoon following our own pursuits, maybe shopping part of the 20 miles of underground walkways, visiting one of the city's museums, or people watching from the giant wheel in the harbor. This evening, we take in Aura, the multi-sensory light show at the Basilica of Notre Dame. We have a fun dinner at one of the Old Port Restaurants. (B, D)

Day 3: Wednesday, July 17 • Quebec City

We travel along the south shore of the St. Lawrence to the Village Quebecois d'Antan, a historical recreation of 18th and 19th century life in the region. Live demonstrators run a general store, farm, make cheese and engage in games. We have lunch at the site before continuing to Quebec City. We check into our hotel in Quebec City for some free time and dinner on our own. **(B, L)**

Day 4: Thursday, July 18 • Quebec City

Today we tour Quebec City. It is one of the oldest cities and the only walled city north of Mexico in North America, established in 1608. We start in the lower city, with a walking tour of the old city. We see Place Royale, the model ships hanging from the ceiling of Notre-Dame-des-Victoires, and various military and commercial buildings. After lunch on our



own, we meet up for afternoon horse drawn carriage rides that take us past the Plaines of Abraham, Parliament, the fortifications, and gates of the Old City. We have dinner at one of the city's oldest restaurants, dining on traditional quebecois food. **(B, D)**

Day 5: Friday, July 19 • Quebec City

Ile d'Orleans was the breadbasket of the original city. The fertile land on an island in the river produced a wide variety of food. Today a bridge makes a convenient connection for our coach. We make stops on the island at one of the old parish churches, the cassis distiller, local artisan galleries, a winery, and shops of local produce. We have lunch at the Chutes de Montmorency (waterfalls) before returning to Quebec City. The rest of the day is free to enjoy on our own. **(B, L)**

Day 6: Saturday, July 20 • Quebec City

Quebec is home to 10 First Nations cultures. Today we visit the Wendat (Huron) traditional site for an immersive experience of traditional lore and history, a hands-on crafting experience and lunch. We return to Quebec where we have some free time before a group dinner. (B, L, D)

Day 7: Sunday, July 21 • Malbaie

We continue our journey along the St. Lawrence today with a stop at the Beaupre Coast. We visit St. Anne de Beaupre, a well-known pilgrimage site. We also visit the Cuivres d'Art to see the copper and silver plate artwork designed by Albert Gilles and his daughters. Some of his copper plates adorn the door of St. Anne's. We continue to Baie St. Paul, considered among the most picturesque villages in Canada. We have free time here to shop, visit the local businesses and have a bit of lunch. Our final stop is our hotel for the next two nights, the Fairmont Manoir Richelieu. Enjoy a walk along the promenade, enjoy the heated pool, or just relax in the public spaces of this lavish hotel. We have dinner as a group this evening. (B, D)

Day 8: Monday, July 22 • Malbaie

Enjoy a relaxed morning at the hotel, enjoying the views or a leisurely breakfast. We depart mid-morning for a whale watching cruise. Up to 13 species of whales summer in the St. Lawrence. Our goal is to spot as many as we can on our three-hour cruise. We return to the hotel for an evening on our own. Visit one of the local restaurants, try your luck at the casino,



or enjoy dinner at the hotel. (B, L)

Day 9: Tuesday, July 23 • Trois Rivieres

We point our coach west and drive along the north shore of the St. Lawrence this time. The road that follows the river is known as the Chemin du Roi (the King's Road) and was the first in the Americas. We see a few of the 18th and 19th century buildings that still stand, but also the narrow, deep plots of land that mark the importance of having river front access. We stop at a local vineyard for a tour and tasting. Lunch is on our own in Trois Rivieres, followed by a tour of major attractions — Borealis (a paper & pulp museum) and Notre Dame du Cap. This evening, we get a rousing send-off with dinner at a maple sugar shack. **(B, D)**

Day 10: Wednesday, July 24 • Return

We return to the Montreal airport for our afternoon flights home. We are full of great food, fond memories shared with loved ones and a desire to come back again. A Bientot! (B)

Payment Schedule:

A deposit of \$500 per person is due with reservation. Final payment is due 90 days prior to departure date. Invoice will be sent out prior to final payment. Passengers may add after this date subject to air and land availability. Generally airlines do not increase the price of a ticket after it has been contracted. However, prior to the issuance of a ticket, airlines may (and regularly do) impose fuel, tax, or security surcharges. In the event a surcharge is imposed after Ed-Ventures has received a final payment, Ed-Ventures will send an additional invoice for the surcharge amount. Early registration is encouraged.

Currency:

Currency exchange rates fluctuate constantly. In the event of a significant drop in the value of the dollar, we reserve the right to add a currency surcharge to the price of the tour.

Refund/Cancellation Policy:

All cancellations must be in writing. The date of postmark will determine the amount of refund due. Refunds are based on the number of days prior to departure date. From the time of deposit to 120 days before departure a \$100 administrative fee plus any airfare penalties will be assessed. From 119-30 days, a \$300 cancellation penalty plus lost airfare deposits and any unrecoverable deposits to ground suppliers will be assessed. Airline tickets once purchased are nonrefundable. Anyone canceling less than 30 days prior to departure will receive no refund.

Purchase of health, baggage, and trip cancellation/interruption insurance is strongly recommended.

Terms and Conditions

We reserve the right to cancel this trip due to lack of subscription. In the event of cancellation of the trip in its entirety, a full refund of all deposits will be made to passengers enrolled at the time of cancellation.
