# *Service Learning in the Yucatan*

### Day 1 • Departure/Mérida

Our journey begins as we board our international flight bound for Merida, capital of the state of Yucatán, Mexico. Upon arrival we meet our Mexico tour guide as well as our host families. We transfer to our homes to get acquainted with our hosts. **D**

### Day 2 • Mérida

We have an early bus transfer to the Mayan archaeological site of Uxmal, known as the “thrice-built city.” At Uxmal we visit the 115-foot high “Pyramid of the Magician” and the impressive “Governor's house,” a wonder of the ancient world and known for its precision and architectural beauty. Then we head off to the fascinating caves of Calcehtok, the biggest cave system in the Yucatan. We return to Merida in the afternoon. **B/L/D**

### Day 3 • Mérida

Today we visit a shelter home, *Hogares Juveniles*, where about twenty kids live. Activities can include painting, gardening, cooking, playing. In the afternoon we have a walking tour of *el centro de Merida* to visit the Cathedral, the “Casa de Montejo,” and the beautiful “Plaza Grande.” At night we see a performance of traditional music and dance, *la Vaqueria*. **B/L/D**

### Day 4 • Mérida

We spend time with elementary school kids this morning as well as assisting their teachers at a public school for students of low-income families. In the afternoon we visit two marvelous *cenotes* located in the small village of Cuzama. *Cenotes* are sinkholes created by underground rivers breaking through the limestone crust of the earth. We can swim in their crystal clear water surrounded by jungle. **B/L/D**

### Day 5 • Mérida

This morning we return to *Hogares Juveniles* for more fun activities. In the afternoon we visit a public hospital, where we enjoy time with the kids and take them a few small gifts from our hometown. The rest of the day is free to spend with our host families. **B/L/D**

### Day 6 • Mérida

We return for a second visit to the elementary school in the morning. In the afternoon we enjoy the hot sun of the Yucatan at Progreso beach. We sing, dance and have dinner at the beach with a traditional *lunada*. **B/L/D**

### Day 7 • Mérida

An excursion off the beaten path takes us to the Mayan village of Tixcocob, where local artisans teach us about

the art of hammock making. We also have an opportunity to practice our Spanish at the panaderia, the tortilleria, and the carniceria at a traditional *mercado*. In the afternoon we go back to *Hogares Juveniles* for our last activity there and to say good bye to our new friends. **B/L/D**

### **Day 8 • Mérida**

Today we visit the Celestun National Park, a habitat for the largest population of Pink Flamingos on the continent. To visit the birds we take a boat tour where we also learn about the importance of mangroves in the region. **B/L/D**

### **Day 9 • Mérida**

Today we visit the famous site of Chichen Itza. This important center combines both majesty and nature, and is an impressive example of the immense depth of the Mayas' knowledge of the cosmos. Our visit includes the largest ball court existing in Mayan world. After our visit we have time to shop for handcrafts. We return to Merida in the afternoon to spend time with our families. This evening we enjoy a farewell dinner at a great Mexican restaurant. **B/L/D**
