Saturday, August 16, 2014 • Depart

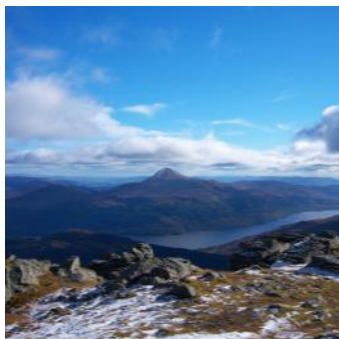
Our adventure begins as we depart the United States on our international flight, and wing our way over the Atlantic to Glasgow, Scotland!

Sunday, August 17, 2014 • Glasgow - Stirling

Upon arrival in Glasgow, after a **short panoramic tour of the city of Glasgow**, we head to the highlands **Stirling Castle**, which dominated Scottish history for centuries and is one of the most imposing castles in Britain. Then we check into our hotel to rest a bit before our welcome dinner tonight. **B/D**



Monday, August 18, 2014 • Inverness



Today we head north through the **Trossachs National Park**, long considered the "Mecca" of travelers to Scotland. Then we travel along Loch Lomond. One can imagine the inspiration for the romantic poem "Lady of the Lake" by Sir Walter Scott. At Fort William, we can view **Ben Nevis**. At 4406 feet, it is the highest mountain in the British

Isles, and the vistas are breathtaking. We drive along Loch Ness in a search for Nessie, the friendly, but elusive, resident monster. We stop for lunch along the way. We arrive in Inverness where dinner in on our own tonight. **B/L**

Tuesday, August 19, 2014 • Inverness

A full day of sightseeing and exploration awaits us. Today we begin by exploring the area of the savage clans and roving barbarians, including a visit to the **Culloden Battlefield**. We will learn about the Jacobite movement, the rise and demise of the clan system, local homes and battlegrounds, and discover many clues to the Celtic, and non-Celtic, ancestors of the Highlanders. **B/D**



Wednesday, August 20, 2014 • Edinburgh

We drive through the Grampian Mountains in the Highlands

and venture down into the **Cairngorms National Park**, the largest in Britain. It covers almost 2300 square miles of beautiful and unspoiled countryside including wild moorlands, and mountains, granite Ice Age glacier heaves, and spectacular valleys, glens, rivers and lochs (lakes) as well as a huge variety of wildlife. We stop in **St Andrew's**, birthplace of golf, and home to the famous Old Course and the Royal and Ancient Golf Club, the focal point of world golf. We drive by Gleneagles and continue to Edinburgh, our home for the next three nights. **B/D**

Thursday, August 21, 2014 • Edinburgh

This morning we enjoy a **panoramic tour of Edinburgh**, a beautiful city, often referred to as the "Athens of the North!" Highlights will include the Walter Scott Monument, the elegant Prince's Street, and a stop to see **Edinburgh Castle**



with its foreboding ramparts and walls, amazing city views, Crown jewels, and the siege gun, Mon's Meg. An optional tour is available for those who would like to tour the castle later today. Our afternoon is free before Tattoo this evening where the Royal Edinburgh Military Tattoo celebrates its Scottish Heritage with the world. Music, dance, and precision our on display with the Massed Pipes and Drums, the Bands of Her Majesty's Royal Marines, cultural troupes, singers and the poignant refrain of the Lone Piper against the stunning backdrop of Edinburgh Castle. **B**

Friday, August 22, 2014 • Edinburgh

Late this morning we head for **Haddington** where we explore the area. We will enjoy lunch at the Waterloo Bistro then continue on to the **Glen Kinchie distillery** for a sample or two before returning to Edinburgh. This evening we share stories of our time in Scotland before heading south tomorrow. **B/L**



Saturday, August 23, 2014 • London

This morning we board the train to London. Upon arrival we get a tour of "London Towne," one of the world's most visited cities. Then we stop for **lunch at a local pub**. This evening we enjoy **a show in the West End**. **B/L**

We head north through the charming Cotswolds, taking in breathtaking views of open countryside crisscrossed by dry

Currency:

Currency exchange rates fluctuate constantly. In the event of a significant drop in the value of the dollar, we reserve the right to add a currency surcharge to the price of the tour.

All cancellations must be in writing. The date of postmark will determine the amount of refund due. Refunds are based on the number of days prior to departure date. From the time of deposit to 99 days before departure a \$100 administrative fee plus any airfare penalties will be assessed. From 99-14 days, a \$300 cancellation penalty plus lost airfare deposits and any unrecoverable deposits to ground suppliers will be assessed. Airline tickets once purchased are nonrefundable. Anyone canceling less than 14 days prior to departure will receive **no refund**.
