Scotland—Wales—England



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Saturday, September 13, 2014 • Departure

Our British Isles adventure begins as we depart the Minneapolis-St. Paul International Airport on our trans-Atlantic flight to Glasgow, Scotland's second-largest city.

Sunday, September 14, 2014 • Edinburgh



Upon arrival in Scotland, we go through customs and immigration and then have a short drive to Edinburgh, Scotland's capital city. We meet our local guide for a panoramic tour of the city, an architectural gem that is often referred to as the "Athens of the North". Highlights include the Royal Mile, the Walter Scott Monument, the bustling Prince's Street and St. Giles Cathedral. We end at Edinburgh Castle, with its foreboding ramparts and walls, amazing city views, crown jewels and the

coronation seat of Scottish kings. Dinner is at our hotel tonight. **D**

Monday, September 15, 2014 • Edinburgh

Today we drive to Stirling, site of two important battles involving William Wallace, of *Braveheart* fame, and Robert the Bruce. We'll tour Stirling Castle, which for centuries played an important role in Scottish history and was the home of the Stuart kings. We also stop at the visitor center at Bannockburn which commemorates Robert the Bruce's victory in 1314 over the English which enabled the Scots to keep their independence. Next we visit a distillery in the enchanting Perthshire region where we sample *The Famous Grouse*, Scotland's favorite whisky. This evening we experience a Scottish *Ceilidh*, a traditional feast with Highland dancing and bagpipe music. Haggis anyone? **B/D**



Tuesday, September 16, 2014 • York

On our way to the English border we will stop to see *Abbotsford*, the home of Sir Walter Scott, the famous Scottish poet and novelist. The beautiful manor and gardens have been preserved much as they were in the celebrated author's time. A guide will take us through the home that includes a library that houses over 9000 rare books and a collection of weapons and armor which features the broadsword of Rob Roy. Afterwards, we travel to Hadrian's Wall, a system of defensive walls and forts that formed the northern border of the Roman Empire. It took countless workers nearly six years to complete the 73-mile structure. Our final destination today is York, one of England's most historic cities. **B/D**

Wednesday, September 17, 2014 • York



We enjoy an orientation tour of York today and a visit to York Minster. Built between 1220 and 1472, the magnificent York Minster is one of the biggest Gothic churches in the world. On the north side are windows called the "Five Sisters"—each only 5 feet wide, but 57 feet tall—which still have the original medieval glass. After our tour, there will be free time to shop along The Shambles, a 900-year-old lane that is often called Europe's best-preserved medieval street. Others

may wish to visit the amazing Jorvik Viking Centre, where the remains of 1,000-year-old houses are preserved and objects used by the Vikings can be examined. **B/D**

Thursday, September 18, 2014 • Northern Wales

Today we continue our sightseeing as we head to Chester for lunch and then spend a couple of leisurely hours exploring this ancient city. Chester boasts the only complete set of medieval walls in Britain. One of England's loveliest cities, Chester is also known for its attractive bridges and parks, gates, cathedrals, as well as the remarkable Rows, a two-tiered arcade with a fantastic collection of shops. Later we continue the short distance to Northern Wales for our overnight. **B/D**

Friday, September 19, 2014 • Northern Wales

We spend the day enjoying the rugged beauty in and around Snowdonia National Park. Our sightseeing includes Conwy, one of Europe's best-preserved medieval fortified towns. Conwy's stunning castle is one of several built by the English King Edward I during his campaign to subdue the Celtic tribes in the 13th century. Mt. Snowdon, the highest peak in Wales at 3560 feet, affords spectacular views of Wales' most mountainous region. Afterwards, we visit the Welsh Slate Museum. From the mid-19th to the mid-20th century, this area was a major supplier of slate roofing tiles. We learn more about the industry and some of the dangers and hardships workers had to face on a daily basis. The tour includes a ride on a narrow gauge railway previously used to transport the slate. **B/D**



Saturday, September 20, 2014 • Stratford-upon-Avon



We travel to Stoke-on-Trent to tour the extensive Wedgwood Visitor Centre and have the opportunity to watch the skilled artisans at work. After watching the artists, some of you may be tempted to duplicate the potting and hand painting skills on your own. Next we stop in Coventry, where legend says Lady Godiva rode through town with

only her long tresses to protect her modesty. During World War II, the town's old cathedral was completely destroyed, but in 1962 the New Cathedral was built next to the ruins and boasts some spectacular stained-glass windows as well as some impressive interior paintings and colors. Next we drive a short distance to Stratford-Upon-Avon, home of William Shakespeare, the "Bard of Avon". **B/D**

Sunday, September 21, 2014 • Stratford-upon-Avon

The writer of 37 plays and 154 sonnets, William Shakespeare is arguably the most famous writer in the English language. Our sightseeing today will center around Shakespeare's birth, school life, marriage at the age of eighteen to Anne Hathaway and his life as a playwright. Sights include the Royal Shakespeare Theatre, the Swan Theatre and Anne Hathaway's Cottage. We have the remainder of the day free for our own pursuits. **B/D**



Monday, September 22, 2014 • Bath area

Today we drive southwest through the Cotswold Hills, a picturesque area known for its steep wooded valleys, rushing streams, quaint villages and thatched roof cottages. Our destination is Stonehenge, a unique and strange collection of standing stones. These mystical stone formations have baffled archaeologists for centuries. After formulating our own theories about this prehistoric enigma, we continue on to Bath. The city, home to the only hot springs in England, is where the Romans built a bath complex in the 1st century AD. A tour of a Roman bathhouse will allow us to admire the well-preserved remains and appreciate the intricate heating and water systems for that time period. **B/D**



Tuesday, September 23, 2014 • London

We drive to Windsor Castle and tour this incredible medieval structure which is most noted as the residence of the royal family. The castle was founded by William the Conqueror, and since the time of Henry I it has been the longest occupied palace by a succession of monarchs in Europe. We'll then transfer to London and check in early at our hotel. Tonight we dine at a pub and afterwards see a show in the West End district, an area in London known for entertainment and the arts. **B/D**

Wednesday, September 24, 2014 • London

This morning a local guide will meet us at our hotel and take us on a tour of London. The highlights include the Houses of Parliament with its massive bell Big Ben, Westminster Abbey, Trafalgar Square, the Tower Bridge, Piccadilly Circus, Buckingham Palace and the Tower of London, a former prison and today the storehouse for the spectacular Crown Jewels. To see London from a different perspective, we take an afternoon cruise on the Thames—from Tower Bridge past St. Paul's, the Globe Theater and the Houses of Parliament. Dinner is on your own this evening. **B**



Thursday, September 25, 2014 • London

Most of the day is unplanned which provides plenty of time to further explore England's largest city. Just a few of the many possibilities include the British Museum, Covent Garden Market, Madame Tussauds, the Imperial War Museum, the Globe Theatre and the Tate, one of the finer art galleries in the world. Some may want to visit Harrods, London's upscale department store. Weather permitting, others may want to board the London Eye, a giant ferris wheel that provides some spectacular views of London. Tonight, we celebrate our final evening in Europe with a farewell dinner. **B/D**

Friday, September 26, 2014 • Return

Regretfully, it's time to say farewell and transfer to the London Airport. We return home with fond memories of quaint towns, bustling cities, historic sites, exquisite works of art and beautiful landscapes. **Tata! B**

Currency:

Currency exchange rates fluctuate constantly. In the event of a significant drop in the value of the dollar, we reserve the right to add a currency surcharge to the price of the tour.

All cancellations must be in writing. The date of postmark will determine the amount of refund due. From the time of deposit to February 13, 2014 a \$50 administrative fee plus any airfare penalties will be assessed.
