European Christmas Markets

Monday, December 1, 2014 • Depart

Our journey begins today with our trans-Atlantic flight to Frankfurt, Germany.

Tuesday, December 2, 2014 • Rothenburg ob der Tauber

Upon arriving at the Frankfurt International Airport, we meet our driver and board our luxury touring coach for the short drive to Rothenburg ob der Tauber. This medieval city is one of only a few in Germany that still has its entire medieval defensive wall intact. Long ago the city was declared a national treasure, and laws prohibited changing the appearance of the original city inside the wall in any way. For us, that means a chance to step back centuries in time in one of the most popular tourist destinations in the country. Rothenburg also has a Christmas market, and after **touring the city** on a short walk with a local guide to learn its history, we will have time to enjoy a smaller but perhaps more quaint market. While the market is a bit smaller in Rothenburg, they have a special Christmas attraction of their own. You will want to stop to visit **Käthe Wohlfahrt's Christkindlmarkt**, an enormous Christmas shop which is open year-round, and which has to actually charge admission for entrance during the holiday season due to its popularity (your entrance will be covered of course). **D**



Wednesday, December 3, 2014 • Rothenburg ob der Tauber

Today we take a short drive to **Nürnberg**. In the past century, Nürnberg had dark ties to the Nazi party, and was the scene of the war trials held by allied forces. In more modern times, it has a much brighter reputation as the site of the best Christmas markets in Germany. Dozens and dozens of stands which are decorated for the season, are set in the city center square, with craftsmen that have hand made a large variety of goods to sell. Some stands are cooking sausages on outdoor grills and others are warming Glühwein, a mix of red wine and spices. The scenes and smells combine to create a picture of Christmas from days gone by, and bring a warmth inside, even for those that don't try the Glühwein. We return Rothenburg for overnight. **B/D**

Thursday, December 4, 2014 • Strasbourg, France

After breakfast, we depart for Strasbourg, France where we tour the **Cathedral of Strasbourg**, **St. Thomas's Church**, and the **University**, the **Astronomical clock** and the historic "**La Petite Strasbourg**" quarter. Our highlight will be exploring Strasbourg's famous Christmas market (since 1570) around its impressive cathedral! While we are walking through the city, we see the work of the talented craftsmen,

and the Bredle Market where we may taste little delicious cakes traditionally prepared during the advent period. **B/D**

Friday, December 5, 2014 • Triberg

Today we head for the beauty of the Black Forest at Christmas time. We stop in **Freiburg** to explore the Christmas Market held on the Rathausplatz with its wide range of traditional arts and crafts from the Black Forest region, including straw shoes and colorful wooden toys. Then we visit the **Gutach Farm Museum** and a **Cuckoo Clock Shop**. We overnight in Triberg where more of the magic of Christmas is on display. **B/D**

Saturday, December 6, 2014 • Oberammergau

We travel southeast to step away from our Christmas theme a bit for the opportunity to see Germany's top tourist attraction. **Neuschwanstein** was the grand palace created by Ludwig II of Bavaria in the foothills of the Alps, and is said to be the inspiration for Walt Disney's castle. We will get to tour the palace and take some memorable photos, before continuing on to Oberammergau. Oberammergau is an attraction in itself. The small village is dotted with ornately painted homes, most depicting biblical scenes. The village is also dotted with woodcarving shops, where handmade carvings are sold, as Oberammergau is a woodcarving center. **B/D**

Sunday, December 7, 2014 • Oberammergau

This morning we tour another of Ludwig's palaces which lies about 15 miles from Oberammergau. Not nearly as grand in stature as Neuschwanstein, the **Palace Linderhof** is tucked into the forest, hidden from view. It was actually the favorite residence of Ludwig, who was a bit of a recluse. A guide will take us through the palace on a tour, and it will become very clear that this



little palace makes up for its size with incredible opulence on the inside. Virtually every room's decor is highlighted by thousands of dollars in gold, and most have priceless artifacts of ivory, rare porcelain and more. After touring the palace, we travel half the distance back to our hotel to stop in the village of **Ettal**. Here we have time to find lunch on our own, and stroll through the beautiful baroque monastery. After lunch, we will visit a **local cheese maker** for a tour and a cheese tasting. We then return for some free time to explore Oberammergau, where incidentally another of **Käthe Wohlfahrt's** Christmas shops is located. **B/D**

Monday, December 8, 2014 • Salzburg

We continue on our journey today, driving south past

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Garmisch and crossing into Austria. We will then turn east and in a short time arrive in Salzburg, the city of Mozart, and *The Sound of Music*. A local guide takes us on a short **walking tour of the city**. This will get us oriented to our home for the next two days, and take us

through **Mirabell Gardens** (*The Sound of Music* setting for the song *Do Re Mi*), and down the streets of the famous **Getreidegasse** (the traditional cobblestoned shopping street in the old part of the city). On our tour, we will go into the home where Mozart was born, and walk through the city's grand cathedral. This evening we will have dinner at the **St Peter Stiftskeller**, the oldest restaurant in Europe, having been documented as early as the year 803. **B/D**

Tuesday, December 9, 2014 • Salzburg

After breakfast this morning, we take a fun excursion outside of Salzburg to tour a **salt mine**. We will don miners garb, and slide our way underground for a truly fun and educational experience. While it's not part of the holiday season, the opportunity to tour this part of the region's history can't be passed up. In the afternoon, we return to Salzburg for some free time to explore Salzburg's Christmas market. Tonight we have dinner on our own. **B**

Wednesday, December 10, 2014 • Freising

The final leg of our journey takes us to Munich, where we meet a **local guide** and spend a short time learning about the history and highlights of the city. We then have one last opportunity to explore a Christmas market, or perhaps you may opt to visit one of the many world-class museums on your own. Tonight we will stay a short distance north of Munich, and very close to the Munich International airport. This will put us close to the airport for tomorrow's departure, and close to the **Weihenstephan Brewery**, a brewery started one thousand years ago by monks. The brewery has a beautiful restaurant serving traditional Bavarian food, and it is here that we will have our farewell **dinner** together in Germany. **B/D**

Thursday, December 11, 2014 • Return

This morning we say *Auf Wiederseh'n* to Germany, and the new friends we have met along the way, as we drive the very short distance to the Munich airport for our return flights to the USA. **B**

Payment Schedule:

A deposit of \$500 per person is due with reservation. Final payment is due 100 days prior to departure date. Invoice will be sent out prior to final payment. Passengers may add after this date subject to air and land availability. Generally airlines do not increase the price of a ticket after it has been contracted. However, prior to the issuance of a ticket, airlines may (and regularly do) impose fuel, tax, or security surcharges. In the event a surcharge is imposed after Ed-Ventures has received a final payment, Ed-Ventures will send an additional invoice for the surcharge amount. Early registration is encouraged.

Currency:

Currency exchange rates fluctuate constantly. In the event of a significant drop in the value of the dollar, we reserve the right to add a currency surcharge to the price of the tour.

Refund/Cancellation Policy:

All cancellations must be in writing. The date of postmark will determine the amount of refund due. Refunds are based on the number of days prior to departure date. From the time of deposit to 99 days before departure a \$100 administrative fee plus any airfare penalties will be assessed. From 99-14 days, a \$300 cancellation penalty plus lost airfare deposits and any unrecoverable deposits to ground suppliers will be assessed. Airline tickets once purchased are nonrefundable. Anyone canceling less than 14 days prior to departure will receive **no refund**.

Purchase of health, baggage, and trip cancellation/interruption insurance is strongly recommended.

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Terms and Conditions

We reserve the right to cancel this trip due to lack of subscription. In the event of cancellation of the trip in its entirety, a full refund of all deposits will be made to passengers enrolled at the time of cancellation. Tour price is based on the value of the dollar and the cost of airfare and is subject to change without notice. Extensions are usually available, but must be requested when booking the tour. Any changes in airfare booking may result in a processing fee. It may be possible, that due to unforeseen events, conditions, or changes in airline schedules, the land portion of the trip may be extended or shortened. Any savings realized by such occurrences will be refunded, however any extra expenses incurred must be borne by the client. Trip cancellation insurance is available.
