Day 1: Thursday, April 30, 2026 • Chicago, Illinois

Today is a day of travel to Chicago, Illinois where our journey begins. Upon arrival, we transfer to the hotel and enjoy free time. **Inflight Meals**

Day 2: Friday, May 1, 2026 • Chicago, Illinois

This morning, we meet our driver and guide and begin our adventure with a **city tour**, taking in highlights of the Windy City's skyline, history, and neighborhoods. Later, we enjoy a captivating **architectural boat tour** along the Chicago River—an iconic way to appreciate the city's world-famous architecture. This evening, enjoy a **welcome dinner** with your fellow travelers as we kick off our journey together. After dinner, we head to the **Willis Tower Skydeck** for breathtaking panoramic views of the city illuminated at night. **D**

Day 3: Saturday, May 2, 2026 • Springfield, Illinois

After breakfast, we board our coach and make a quick stop at the iconic "Route 66 Begin" sign for a group photo. We continue on to Wilmington, where we pause for a quirky photo opportunity with the Gemini Giant—a 30-foot-tall statue and one of the famous "Muffler Men" that dotted Route 66 in the 1960s. From there, we travel to Springfield, Illinois, where our afternoon is dedicated to exploring the life and legacy of Abraham Lincoln. We visit the Abraham Lincoln Presidential Library and Museum, tour the Old State Capitol, and pay our respects at Lincoln's Tomb. This evening, we enjoy dinner at a historic local restaurant, followed by an overnight stay in Springfield. B/D

Day 4: Sunday, May 3, 2026 • St. Louis, Missouri

This morning we head to **St. Louis**, where our first stop is the city's most famous landmark—the **Gateway Arch**, a stunning 630-foot-tall and equally wide stainless steel structure that stands as a symbol of westward expansion. We ride the tram to the top for breathtaking views of the city and the **Mississippi River**. Next, we visit the **Old Courthouse**, where the pivotal **Dred Scott** case was argued, shaping the course of American history. Lunch is on your own at the vibrant **City Foundry**, a modern food hall featuring a variety of local vendors. In the afternoon, we explore the **City Museum**, a whimsical, interactive attraction built from reclaimed architectural and industrial materials. After checking into our hotel, we gather for **dinner at a fine-dining restaurant**, possibly accompanied by live jazz music to complete the St. Louis experience. **B/D**

Day 5: Monday, May 4, 2026 • St. Louis, Missouri

We begin our day with a visit to **Grant's Farm**, once the home of Ulysses S. Grant and later the ancestral estate of the Busch family, founders of Anheuser-Busch, where we'll see the famous Budweiser Clydesdales and explore the scenic grounds. From there, we head to **Laclede's Landing**, a historic riverfront district, for lunch on our own. In the afternoon, we visit the **National Blues Museum** to explore the roots of the Blues and its influence on all modern American music. Later, we tour the **Anheuser-Busch Brewery**, one of the oldest and largest breweries in the country, where we learn about the brewing process and enjoy some samples. We end the day with **dinner and a live music performance**, a fitting close to a day full of history, culture, and entertainment. **B/D**

Day 6: Tuesday, May 5, 2026 • Springfield, Missouri

After breakfast and check-out, we visit **Fantastic Caverns**, one of only four ride-through caves in the world—and the only one in North America. This remarkable natural wonder features towering columns, delicate soda straws sparkling with minerals, and tiny cave pearls resting in crystal-clear pools, all viewed

comfortably from a Jeep-drawn tram. We then continue to Springfield to explore the Route 66 Car Museum and the Birthplace of Route 66 Roadside Park, honoring America's most iconic highway. This evening, we dine at and explore Finley Farms, where the historic Ozark Mill has been beautifully restored and reimagined. Modeled after the family farms that once covered the Ozarks, the property features a high-yield urban farm supplying seasonal produce to on-site restaurants, along with blooming flower fields and a shaded mushroom yard—creating the perfect setting for a memorable farm-to-table experience. B/D

Day 7: Wednesday, May 6, 2026 • Oklahoma City, Oklahoma Our day begins in Joplin, Missouri, with a stroll through the colorful Route 66 Mural Park, a vibrant artistic tribute to the legendary highway. We then drive the short but scenic 13-mile stretch of Kansas Route 66, stopping at Luigi's Pit Stop near Galena, home to life-sized replicas of characters from the movie Cars. Continuing on to Catoosa, Oklahoma, we stop for a fun photo at the Blue Whale, a quirky roadside attraction built by zoologist Hugh S. Davis as a family swimming spot. In Tulsa, we visit the Cyrus Avery Bridge and monument, honoring the "Father of Route 66." From there, we travel to Oklahoma City, where we check in to our hotel. This evening, explore Bricktown, a lively and revitalized district known for its repurposed warehouse spaces, canalside walking paths, shops, and diverse dining options. Dinner is on your own tonight—soak in the vibrant atmosphere as you choose from a variety of local restaurants. B

Day 8: Thursday, May 7, 2026 • Oklahoma City, Oklahoma This morning, we visit the Oklahoma City National Memorial and Museum, a powerful site honoring the victims, survivors, and heroes of the 1995 bombing. Then, we explore the Centennial Land Run Monument, a striking collection of bronze sculptures capturing the spirit and energy of the 1889 land run. After lunch on your own, we visit the National Cowboy & Western Heritage Museum, the nation's premier institution showcasing Western history, art, and culture. Later, we stroll through Automobile Alley, a vibrant district where restored 1920s brick buildings glow with vintage neon—once home to Oklahoma City's original Model-T dealerships. We enjoy dinner together. B/D

Day 9: Friday, May 8, 2026 • Amarillo, Texas

Following breakfast, we begin our journey west. In Clinton, Oklahoma, we stop at the Oklahoma Route 66 Museum, where exhibits tell the story of the legendary highway and the dreams that drove it. Our next stop is the whimsical Cadillac Ranch in Amarillo, Texas. Created in 1974, it consists of ten Cadillacs buried nose-first in the ground. Visitors are encouraged to bring spray paint to paint the cars. This evening, we explore Amarillo's Cultural District, including Historic Downtown, the Sunset Center Galleries, Route 66 murals, and the famous Hoofprints of the American Quarter Horse statues. We enjoy dinner at a classic Texas steakhouse. B/D

Day 10: Saturday, May 9, 2026 • Santa Fe, New Mexico

After breakfast, we drive toward **Santa Fe**, stopping en route in **Tucumcari** to admire the town's colorful murals—over 50 of them—many created by artists Doug and Sharon Quarles. We browse **Tee Pee Curios**, a quirky Route 66 landmark offering local artisan jewelry and nostalgic finds. Although some neon signs were damaged in 2023, restoration efforts are underway to bring the glow back. Upon arrival in Santa Fe, we enjoy a guided **city tour** followed by dinner at a local restaurant. **B/D**

Day 11: Sunday, May 10, 2026 • Flagstaff, Arizona

We depart early this morning and drive through the dramatic landscapes of the **Painted Desert** and **Petrified Forest National Park**, where vibrant colors and ancient fossilized trees create an otherworldly experience. Along the way, we pass the quirky **Wigwam Motel** in Holbrook, with its iconic concrete teepees. We stop in **Winslow**, **Arizona**, to visit the famous **Standin' on the Corner Park**, inspired by the Eagles' song "Take It Easy". Enjoy a photo op with the mural, flatbed Ford, and statue that immortalize this beloved lyric. We then continue to **Flagstaff** where we check into our hotel. We enjoy dinner together. **B/D**

Day 12: Monday, May 11, 2026 • Flagstaff, Arizona
We enjoy a full-day excursion to Grand Canyon National
Park, one of the Seven Natural Wonders of the World. Here, we
take in awe-inspiring views from multiple viewpoints along the
South Rim and learn about the canyon's geological and cultural
history. We return to Flagstaff in the evening. B

Day 13: Tuesday, May 12, 2026 • Las Vegas, Nevada
After breakfast, we travel to Seligman, Arizona, the inspiration
for Radiator Springs in Disney's Cars. We stop at Angel &
Velma's Route 66 Gift Shop, where Angel, a former barber,
famously fought to preserve Route 66. Next, we visit the
whimsical Snow Cap Drive-In, built from scrap lumber in 1953,
featuring a colorful 1936 Chevy with a Christmas tree in the
back and plenty of Route 66 humor. We then continue to
Oatman, a lively old mining town known for its wild burros that
roam freely through its historic streets. In the late afternoon, we
arrive in Las Vegas, check into our hotel, and enjoy dinner on
your own tonight. B

Today is a free day to experience Las Vegas at your own pace.

Day 15: Wednesday, May 14, 2026 • Los Angeles, California This morning, we board the coach and drive toward Los Angeles. Along the way, we stop in Oro Grande at Elmer's Bottle Tree Ranch, a folk art installation made of colorful glass bottles, scrap metal, and vintage signs. We then make a quick photo stop at the nostalgic Wigwam Motel in San Bernardino, one of the last remaining "sleep in a teepee" motels on Route 66. We check into our Los Angeles hotel and enjoy a farewell dinner together at a local restaurant. B/D

Day 16: Thursday, May 15, 2026 • Los Angeles, California Today is a free morning to explore Los Angeles at your own pace

Today is a free morning to explore Los Angeles at your own pace - perhaps do some last-minute shopping or soak in a bit more of the local culture. We regroup for lunch before we head to the iconic **Santa Monica Pier** for a final stop. Here, we have the chance to snap a photo at the famous "End of the Trail" Route 66 sign—a perfect way to commemorate your journey. We then transfer to the airport in time for our late afternoon flight home, filled with great memories and new friendships. **B/L**

A second deposit of \$1,500 per person is due on November 1, 2025. Final payment is due 100 days prior to departure date (January 20, 2026). Invoice will be sent out prior to final payment. Passengers may add after this date subject to air and land availability. Generally airlines do not increase the price of a ticket after it has been contracted. However, prior to the issuance of a ticket, airlines may (and regularly do) impose fuel, tax, or security surcharges. In the event a surcharge is imposed after Ed-Ventures has received a final payment, Ed-Ventures will send an additional invoice for the surcharge amount. Early registration is encouraged.

Currency:

Currency exchange rates fluctuate constantly. In the event of a significant drop in the value of the dollar, we reserve the right to add a currency surcharge to the price of the tour.

Refund/Cancellation Policy:

All cancellations must be in writing. The date of postmark will determine the amount of refund due. Refunds are based on the number of days prior to departure date. From the time of deposit to 100 days before departure a \$200 administrative fee plus any airfare penalties will be assessed. From 99-46 days, a \$750 per person cancellation penalty plus lost airfare deposits and any unrecoverable deposits to ground suppliers will be assessed. Airline tickets once purchased are nonrefundable. Anyone canceling 45 days or less prior to departure will receive **no refund**.

Purchase of health, baggage, and trip cancellation/interruption insurance is strongly recommended.

Terms and Conditions

We reserve the right to cancel this trip due to lack of participation. In the event of cancellation of the trip in its entirety, a full refund of all deposits will be made to passengers enrolled at the time of cancellation.
