Tuesday, August 20, 2013 • Depart

Wednesday, August 21, 2013 • Newark

Thursday, August 22, 2013 • Newark

Whether you're looking for a bargain, some hard-to-find rarity, or just want to browse, Newark is the place to be today as it boasts one of the largest antique fairs in Europe. Dinner is on our own. **B**

Friday, August 23, 2013 0149 • Bath

After some additional antique shopping time this morning, we board our coach and travel through the charming Cotswolds. We take in breathtaking views of open countryside crisscrossed by dry stone walls and bustling market towns en route to Jane Austen's birthplace, Bath. It's a beautiful UNESCO World Heritage listed Georgian town with delightful crescents, terraces and architecture. Dinner is on our own. **B**

Saturday, August 24, 2013 • Bath

A local guide joins us today as we explore the shops, warehouses, and antiques of Bath. Dinner is on our own. The evening is open for exploring Bath. **B**

Sunday, August 25, 2013 • Bath

Shopping at a large flea market and an English tea will fill our day. The evening is free. **B**

Monday, August 26, 2013 • London

Today on our way to London, we visit Stonehenge, the most popular prehistoric monument in the world. We marvel at the huge stones that were brought from Preseli Mountains and discover the mysteries surrounding the slaughter stone and earth barrows, where the late-Stone Age Beaker people lie buried. Tonight we enjoy dinner at a London pub and a cruise on the Thames River. **B/D**

Tuesday, August 27, 2013 • London

We have the entire day to explore on our own. Just a few of the many possibilities are Portabella Road, the British Museum, the Docklands or Greenwich area, the British War Museum, and for art lovers, the Tate Gallery. Or maybe an excursion to Hampton Court Palace or Kew Gardens? Why not go to St. James Church or Westminster Abbey to do a brass rubbing, and bring back one of the nicest souvenirs possible? Certainly of interest would be an hour or two at Harrods, one of the finest department stores in Europe. **B**

Wednesday, August 28, 2013 • Brugge

We make our way from London to Brussels on the Eurostar Train. Eurostar speeds you through the Channel Tunnel, one of Europe's biggest infrastructure projects to date. The \$15 billion Chunnel makes the old dream of a ground link between Great Britain and continental Europe a reality for the first time since the Ice Ages. Its length is 31 miles, of which 23 miles are underwater. Upon arrival in Brussels, we meet our new coach and driver and depart for Brugge. En route we stop in Ghent to visit a mustard shop. **B**

Thursday, August 29, 2013 • Brugge

We start the day with a canal cruise in Brugge and then it is off to search for hidden gems and treasures. Not only will we find antiques but also Belgium chocolate and lace. **B**

Friday, August 30, 2013 • Brugge

We have a big day planned of warehouse shopping around Belgium as we find things to finish filling our container. If you prefer, you can continue to enjoy this historic city which is sometimes referred to as the "Venice of the North." **B**

Saturday, August 31, 2013 • Waterloo

After an early breakfast, we head just across the border into northern France to Lille, home to one of the biggest markets in France. It's called *La Braderie* and is packed over the first weekend of September. It attracts over a million visitors and boasts around 200 kilometers of paved stalls. So be prepared for a long hike in the market place! **B**

Sunday, September 1, 2013 • Brussels

This morning we are off to the Waterloo flea market and what one travel writer called the top market on the mainland of Europe. It is held every Sunday morning in the car park of the Carrefour supermarket in Waterloo. The 300 or so stalls are all laid out in an orderly grid so it's easy to cover the whole market and not get confused about the location of a particular trader. It offers a good mix of genuine antiques and

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more contemporary collectables, but be cautious of the replicas. After purchasing the last of our treasures, we board our coach and depart for Brussels. This evening we enjoy a farewell dinner. **B**

Monday, September 2, 2013 • Return

Today we transfer to the airport for our return flight home. **B**

A deposit of \$500 is due with registration. Final Payment is due May 20, 2013. Invoice will be sent out prior to final payment. In the event a surcharge is imposed after we have received final payment, we will send an additional invoice for the surcharge amount. *Early registration is encouraged.*

Currency:

Currency exchange rates fluctuate constantly. In the event of a significant drop in the value of the dollar, we reserve the right to add a currency surcharge to the price of the tour.

Refund/Cancellation Policy:

All cancellations must be in writing and the date of postmark will determine the amount of refund due. Refunds are based on the number of days prior to the departure date. From the time of deposit to 100 days before departure, a \$100 per person administrative fee will be assessed. From 99-15 days, a \$300 per person penalty plus any nonrefundable deposit to ground suppliers as well as penalties imposed by the airlines will be assessed. Airline tickets once issued are not refundable. Anyone canceling less than 14 days prior to departure will receive **no refund**.

Purchase of health, baggage and trip cancellation insurance is strongly recommended.
